

A Secured by Design home is four times less likely to be burgled than a none Secured by Design home













1999 West Yorkshire Police and University of Huddersfield conducted evaluation of SBD housing in West Yorkshire







- Do houses built to SBD standards experience less crime than non-SBD counterparts?
- Do residents living in SBD houses experience less fear of crime?
- Is SBD displacing crime?
- Is the SBD standard improving?







- Methodology included several different strands.
- Police recorded crime:
- Properties refurbished to SBD standard (before and after).
- Properties newly built to SBD standard (25 SBD and 25 non-SBD matched pairs).
- Self reported crime:
- Survey of residents (250 SBD and 250 Non-SBD residents – 10 from each estate).







- SBD Refurbishments:
- Total crime fell by 55% relative to pre-SBD period.
- SBD New Build:
- Burglary 71% higher within the non-SBD sample.
- Total crime 34% higher within the non-SBD sample.
- Crime Switch?
- 36 crime categories analysed, 5 were higher within the SBD sample – damage offences, ABH and GBH.
- Damage often attempt (therefore failed) burglary.
- ABH/GBH not linked to escalation (increase in use, or threat of violence due to failure to overcome security).
- Use and threat of violence both lower in SBD sample.







- Self-Reported *experiences* of crime/disorder:
- 2.9% of SBD respondents had been burgled in previous year, compared to...
- 8.4% of non-SBD respondents and 8% of British Crime Survey respondents (same housing tenure).
- Self-Reported *perceptions* of crime/disorder:
- 11% of SBD respondents felt very unsafe on streets surrounding home at night, compared to...
- 19% of non-SBD respondents.
- 4% of SBD respondents felt *very unsafe* at home alone at night, compared to...
- 8% of non-SBD respondents.








- Key finding SBD is an Evolving Standard.
- Of the sample of estates built between 1994 and 1998 (bear in mind this was published in 1999)...
- Year on year improvement.
- Mean rate of burglary for SBD estates built in 1994 was 171% of burglary rate of Non-SBD estates built in that year.
- By 1998, mean rate of burglary for SBD estates built that year, was 45% of Non-SBD estates built in that year.















- Sample of estates in 1999 study were built between 1994 and 1998 (residents had to have resided for one year).
- Sample pre-dated BS7950, PAS-24 and many process changes.
- Knowing that between 1994 and 1998 SBD had improved so much, very likely that 1999-2009 will see even greater improvements.







- Repeating the 1999 evaluation.
- The new sample...
- SBD estates built in 2006/07 most recent year to allow one year crime data.
- 346 properties, 16 developments.







- Analysis of Police Recorded Crime Data:
- Do residents on SBD estates experience less crime and disorder than non-SBD counterparts?
- Residents' Survey:
- Do residents on SBD estates experience less self-reported crime and disorder?
- Do residents on SBD estates experience less fear of crime?
- Visual Audits:
- Are there fewer signs of visual disorder on SBD estates?







- Additional area of analysis.
- Revisit a sample of developments from original analysis (built 1994-1998).
- Has the crime reduction performance been maintained, improved, deteriorated?
