





#### Web 2.0 tools in PDP

- Recent learning theory has recognised the social nature of learning (Leslie & Landon 2008)
- The full potential of Web 2.0 has yet to be realised but benefits to date indicate the following:
- Student owns PDP but despite the increased independence of their learning tutor support is still needed.
- We need to recognise different categories of digital learners which will help us develop a typology

## DEL.ICIOUS AND SOCIAL BOOKMARKING

- What is Delicious?
- Delicious is a social bookmarking service that allows users to tag, save, manage and share web pages from a centralized source. With emphasis on the power of the community, Delicious greatly improves how people discover, remember and share on the Internet.
- Business students can use it to evidence their PDP as well as demonstrate their knowledge of websites most helpful to their career planning and employability

#### SOCIAL BOOKMARKING

- A definition: Social bookmarking allows you to store your items of interest on the web instead of inside your web browser.
- This has added benefits as you are able to access them from any internet-connected computer and share your finds with other users.
- Once you have registered for a service, they are free to use.
- If sold on the basis of increasing employability through networking this can be a very powerful tool




#### RECOMMENDATIONS
