



- User activity data
 - record of a user's actions on a website or software system or other relevant institutional service

 record of what a user has viewed on a website or software system or other relevant institutional service


Defining Usage Data *some library examples...*







Trends in Borrowing unique titles circ'ing per acad. year




unique titles (bib#s)









Library Impact Data Project book loans at Huddersfield (5 years)










Library Impact Data Project *book loans & Athens (2009/10)*





Library Impact Data Project project hypothesis



- "There is a statistically significant correlation across a number of universities between library activity data and student attainment."
 - at this early stage, for books & e-resource usage, the correlation appears to be significant across **all** partner libraries
